

Guidelines for the Research Study Presentation

Research study presentation will comprise of what each of you is going to speak as well as running your ppt along with it. It will reflect how well you have collaborated within your group.

Some of the guidelines for an effective presentation of any research study are:

- Always time your presentation.
- Give a brief introduction before you start the presentation.
- You must practice your presentation. PowerPoint software allows you to make notes on each slide, and this can be printed and kept for reference.
- Pronunciation of words that you are unsure of must be checked before the presentation.
- The presenter must use the slides to emphasize a point, keep oneself on track, and illustrate a point with a graphic or photo. Text must not be read out.
- You must not tell that audience to read the text.
- Some suggested tools that can be used for your research study are -surveys, questionnaires, experiments/ simulations, reference material/ sources, interviews, real-life experiences. You may use any / all / any other tool as per the requirements of the topic allocated to our group.
